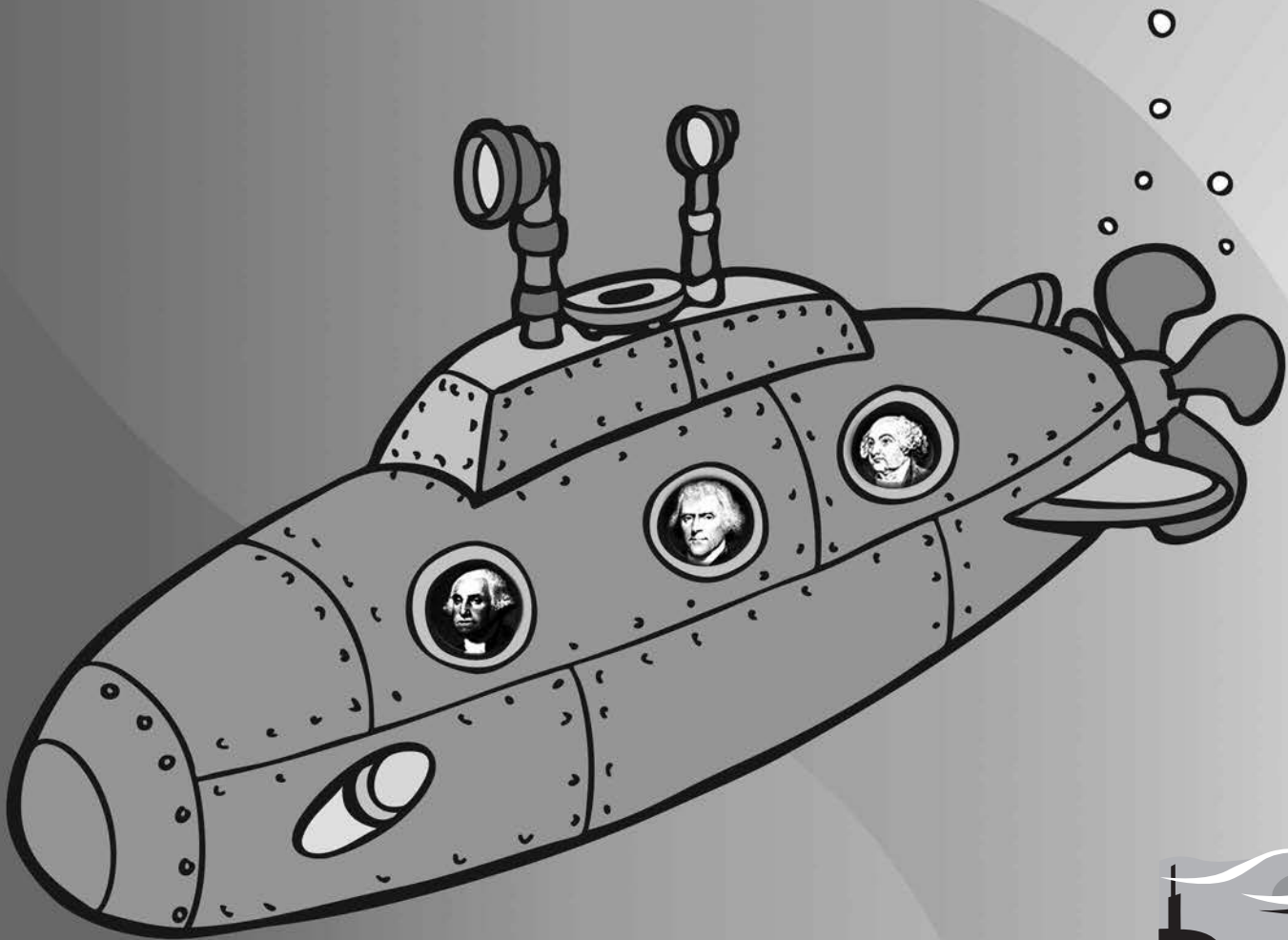

As we celebrate Presidents' Day Weekend, 2011, please join us in remembering and having some fun with three American presidents—the first three ever to hold the title, in fact—and the subs named for them:



George Washington, John Adams, and Thomas Jefferson. Play submarine Sudoku, connect the dots to find some presidential pictures, take a photo with a historic sail, and more. And don't forget to check out "Presidential Pursuits" at the end of this book: find three special objects in the Museum and be entered in a drawing to win a real patch from one of the three featured subs:

USS GEORGE WASHINGTON (SSBN-598), USS JOHN ADAMS (SSBN-620), and USS THOMAS JEFFERSON (SSBN-618)!

Although George Washington never had false teeth made of wood, he did, over the course of his life, have dentures made of lead and ivory and from the teeth of people, sheep, and cows.

Most of John Adams's teeth fell out over the course of his life, but he wouldn't wear dentures.

Thomas Jefferson spoke 6 languages.

USS JOHN ADAMS (SSBN-620) completed 32 patrols armed with POLARIS missiles. After being converted to carry POSEIDON missiles, she completed 43 more patrols.

John Adams and Thomas Jefferson died on the same day, the 50th anniversary of the signing of the Declaration of Independence.

George Washington was the only president who never lived in the White House.

In 1789, when George Washington became president, there were only 13 stars on the American flag.

Unlike many men in his day and age, George Washington never wore a wig—he just put powder in his hair so it would look white.

The faces of George Washington and Thomas Jefferson that are carved into South Dakota's Mount Rushmore are 60 feet tall—that's as big as a 6-story building!

USS GEORGE WASHINGTON (SSBN-598) was 380 feet long and could carry 16 POLARIS missiles. In 1960, she became the first sub to successfully launch a ballistic missile from beneath the surface of the ocean.

Afterwards, her captain sent a message to President Dwight Eisenhower: "POLARIS—FROM OUT OF THE DEEP TO TARGET. PERFECT."

Until George W. Bush was elected in 2000, 8 years after George H.W. Bush's term ended, John Adams and his son, John Quincy Adams, were the only father and son to both be elected President.

In 1976, USS THOMAS JEFFERSON (SSBN-618) lost all electrical power and propulsion while submerged at sea. Her crew sprang into action and managed to put out fires that had broken out and control flooding that threatened to sink the boat.

Because he felt it was very important for America to have a strong navy, John Adams created the office of Secretary of the Navy. For this reason, he has been called the "Father of the Navy."

John Adams and his family got lost on the way to the White House, which is understandable because they were the first presidential family to live there!

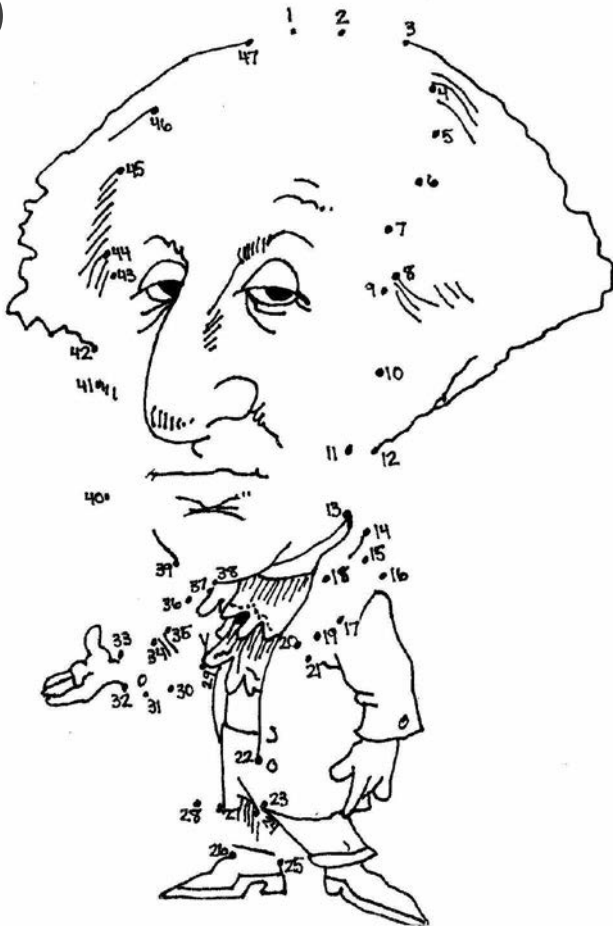

3. Every 3 by 3 square of the larger 9 by 9 square must include all the letters in the word SUBMARINE, once again in any order.

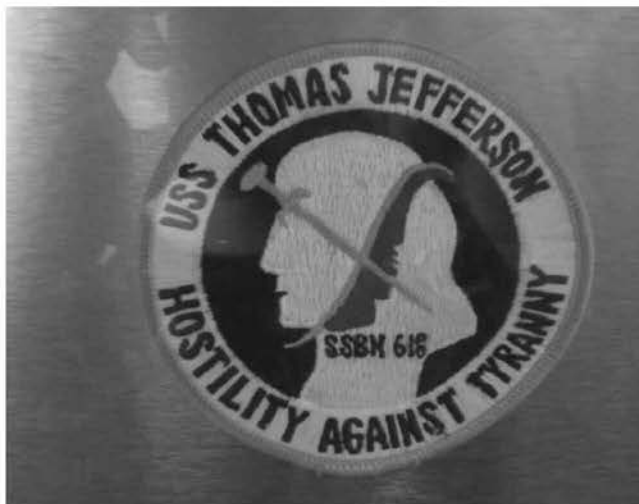
Find this plaque belonging to USS GEORGE WASHINGTON.



Find this piece of USS JOHN ADAMS's pressure hull—the skin of the sub. It's even carved in the shape of the boat's initials!



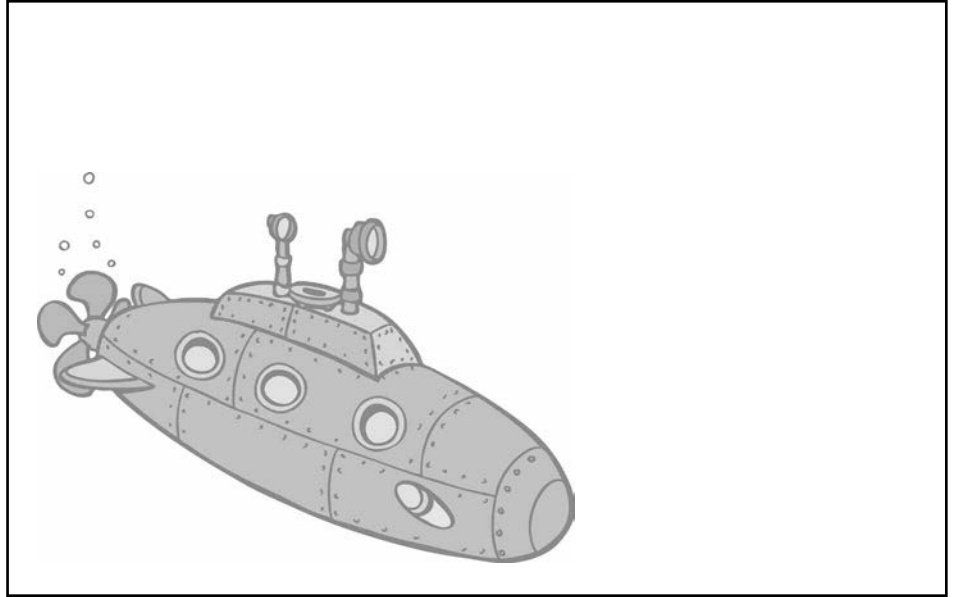
Find this patch belonging to USS THOMAS JEFFERSON.
